Early Learning Sites can choose to receive a rating which is based on a set of California state standards known to promote high-quality early learning for kids. Ratings help programs identify how they are already providing quality early learning and ways they can keep improving. Regardless of what level programs start on when they join the Childcare Quality System, their commitment is to provide high-quality early learning to prepare your child for Kindergarten. The Childcare Quality System programs value your child's health, happiness, and development.



rating standards include:

- -Interactions between teachers and children
- -How teachers meet and support the
 - developmental needs of children
- -The health and safety of the classroom
- -Staff qualifications and training
- -Group size, number of children per teacher

A Rating can be between one and five points.
